Arkansas Strategic Committee for Maternal Health

Governor Sanders issued an executive order in March 2024 to engage legislators, advocacy organizations, health care providers, and other stakeholders in a Maternal Health Working Group

September 2024: Committee issued recommendations covering:

- Health care access & Medicaid,
- Clinical & practice improvements
- Data, reporting & technology





2025 Legislative Actions: Healthy Moms, Healthy Babies Act

- Requires Medicaid to cover:
 - 1. Prenatal, delivery, and postpartum services
 - 2. Depression screening for pregnant women
 - 3. Remote blood pressure monitoring and ultrasounds
- Ends global billing
- Increases OB reimbursement by 70%
- Establishes presumptive eligibility for pregnant women



2025 Legislative Actions: Other Maternal Health Initiatives

- Act 627 requires Medicaid and other health plans to cover lactation consultation services
- Act 965 establishes state certification for doulas and requires Medicaid and other health plans to cover their services
- Act 435 establishes state certification for community health workers and requires Medicaid and other health plans to cover their services
- Act 866 requires Medicaid to cover services provided at a birthing center



Transforming Maternal Health (TMaH) Grant

- \$17 million, 10-year federal grant to improve maternal health in Arkansas
- Current efforts include:
 - Workforce and integration assessments/toolkits for doulas and midwives
 - Certified Nurse Midwifery (CNM) program
 - Training additional doulas
 - Training perinatal CHW
 - CHW certification in perinatal mental health
 - Training for group perinatal care model
 - Training and technical assistance with telemedicine and remote monitoring




Maternal Health Services in Local Health Units
